CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

The following City Administrator's Report, while respectfully submitted to the Mayor and City Council, is provided and available to the general public to inform them of the status of City projects and activities. This report, as well as the monthly department reports, is placed on the City's website.

- Along with Deputy Treasurer Bernal, held a phone meeting with TVI where we looked into maturity of bonds and reinvestment.
- Attended the final session and graduated from of the Northwest Women's Leadership Academy (NWWLA) in Renton. I was very fortunate to have been accepted into the inaugural class of the Academy. The final session provided a graduation ceremony and acknowledgment of NWWLA supporters. All members provided a brief testimonial of what we gained from the Academy. Coaches were available to help us think big and bold when it came to professional development.
- Along with Mayor Barrow, met with representatives from BDI to discuss recycling containers and waste disposal.
