Approval of Minutes:

Motion: Board Member Jaeniffer Kaiser moved to approve the August 30th 2016 minutes. Motion seconded by Chairman Manny Choi. Motion passed unanimously.

ACTION & DISCUSSION ITEMS

Pool Discussion

City Administrator Maria Peña reported that Council had discussed and approved the expense of \$15,000 to replace the sand filter for the pool.

In regards to the repair, there were questions that would need to be addressed by Public Works Director Larry Turner.

Park Board discussed pool operations for this coming season. Jason Janosky had been hired as the Pool Manager and had been working on setting up lifeguard training with Dorothy Krein. Jason Janosky stated he knew of three lifeguards interested. There was discussion regarding the blue slide operation. The blue slide in the deep end would be operational but would only be while Pool Manager Janosky was available to do so. The pool would run without heated water, pool covers could be used to keep in natural heat and the two big slides would not be operational.

It was decided to have two sessions per day, two hours each with a half hour break in between. Pool tentative opening date would be June 14th and be closed by August 19th. The pool hour sessions would be from 3:00pm-5:00pm and 5:30pm-7:30pm. The price would remain at \$3.00 each session, recalling that last year there was only one session. It was discussed not to issue discounted passes this season. There would be no swimming lessons but the pool would be available for rentals on closed days; Sundays and Mondays but with lifeguard availability.

Budget Review

City Clerk Treasurer Rose Courneya discussed the Pool budget; she reported that last season the Pool brought in \$3,109 in admissions pass revenues. This season she estimated \$5,000 in admissions pass revenues and budgeted five hours, five days a week it included set up and clean-up for a total of six lifeguards. Expenditures for salary wages were also increased due to the minimum wage increase for 2017.

Pioneer Park Pavilion Rental

It was suggested that the Pioneer Park Pavilion rental fee be increased to \$10.00 an hour with a minimum fee of 4 hours per rental. If Council approved, it would need to be amended in the City's Master Fee Schedule when increased.

Other

Board Member Jaeniffer Ang Kaiser had a citizen complaint of the Pioneer Park Baseball Fields not being maintained. CA Maria Peña stated the season had just got started and Public Works Director Larry Turner was aware.
